Please note the reports attached to this agenda items regarding the sales tax/use tax that is a part of a City of Lavon 380 agreement with Trophy Signature Homes and Bloomfield Homes where they allocate the sales tax for materials purchased for Lavon homes to Lavon rather than to the city where the items were purchased. With that accounting, the two homebuilders dedicate those sale/use taxes 100% of the 0.5% sales tax to the LEDC and to the Road Improvement Fund and for the 1% of the City General Fund Use Tax which comes to the Lavon: 80% of that is returned to the homebuilder with Lavon retaining the 20%.

In speaking with the technical service portion of Civic Plus, Teresa informed me that the upgrade to Drupal 9 may require a redesigned web site. As I investigate further, I will let you know when a new web site will be required to fit their new platform.

"Last year you received an email communicating the upgrade to your website to a more advanced version of Drupal, the opensource code base that operates your website's content management system (CMS). Currently we don't have a specific timeline for that migration. We are working daily to get the migration tool perfected and once that has been achieved, we will come up with a plan and clear estimated timelines for clients. I understand that lack of specifics can be frustrating but please know that our goal is to make the migration process as seamless as possible for you. Also know that I will keep you informed as we move forward.

Because of the release of the Drupal 9 upgrade and the eventual conversion of all clients we are not initiating Drupal 7 redesigns or any development projects currently. During migration you will have the option to purchase a fresh redesign if you choose. Details on redesign options will be included once we have clear estimated timelines for migration.

Annual the Lavon EDC utilizes the services of The Flyer Group formerly Aerial Map Services to update the aerial map and then publish paper maps as needed for marketing efforts. Attached is the annual invoice for the mapping services. This includes updates as needed and a digital version of the map is also attached. This digital map was recently updated to include the new elementary school and the developing Hillstead Subdivision to the south of FM 483. See that attached map. Printing of the aerial map is a separate cost.

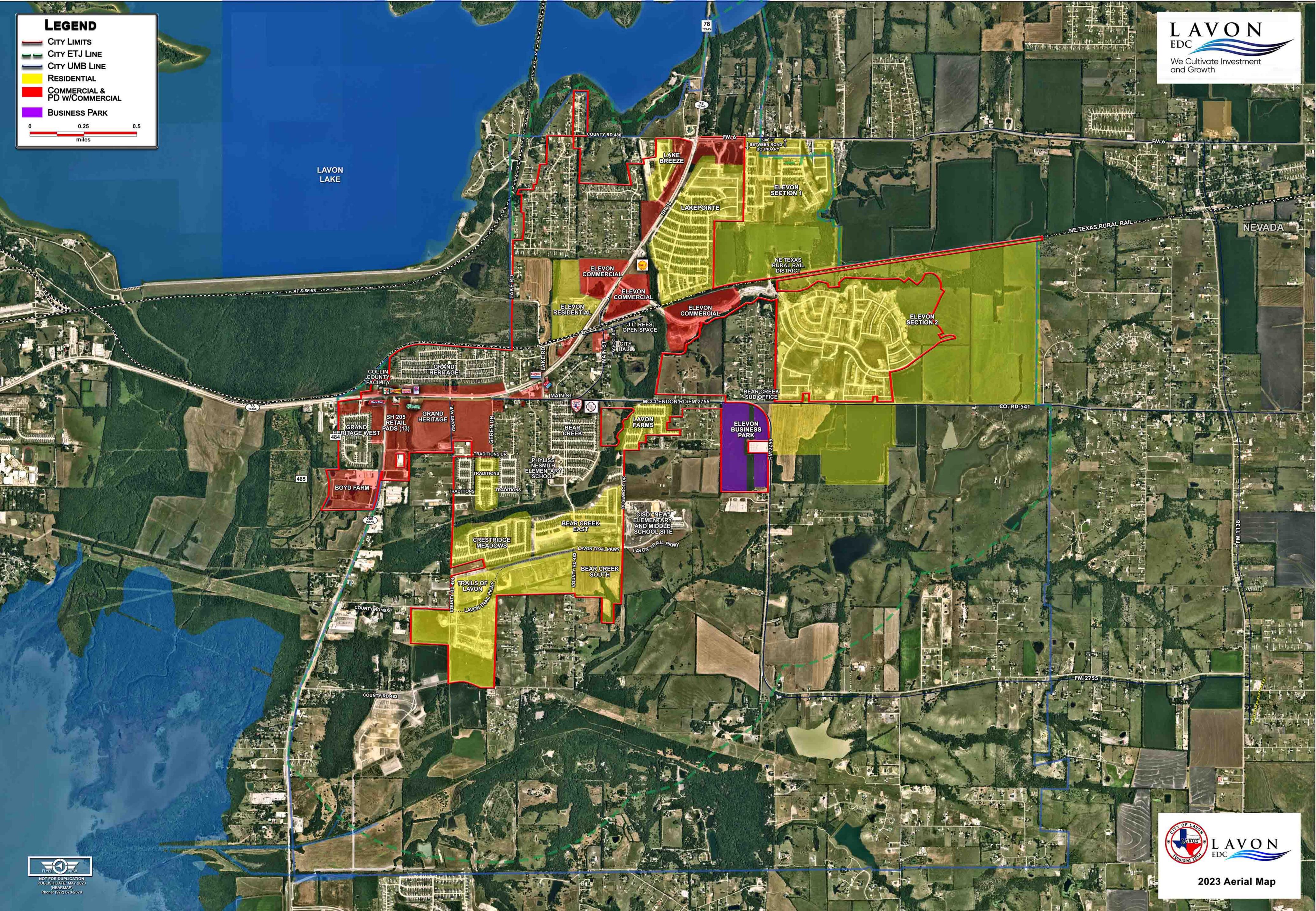

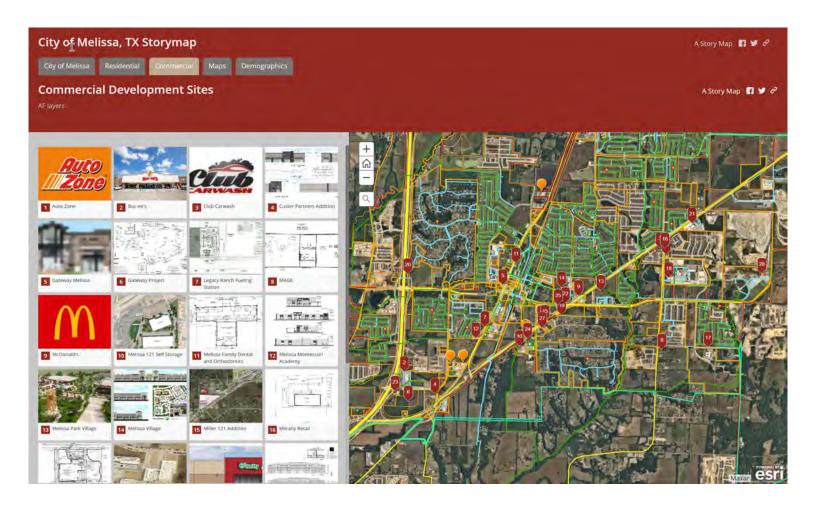

What is an Economic Development Council (EDC)?

The mission of the Lavon Economic Development Corporation (LEDC) is to strengthen and diversify the economic base of the City of Lavon. The EDC serving the City of Lavon, was established in 2004 as a 4B Corporation, now known as a Type B Corporation. It is a governmental, nonprofit economic development corporation reporting to the Lavon City Council. The EDC was established to encourage top-quality businesses to place job-generating investments in Lavon, while creating a superior environment for business expansion and retention.

The EDC generates interest in the region through the publication of marketing materials and data and represents the City of Lavon on marketing missions throughout the state of Texas and occasionally the nation. The EDC encourages businesses to locate in the region by facilitating their site selection needs in a fair, professional and confidential manner. Each time the EDC locates a new business investment in the region, nearly every company and organization benefits. With more money flowing through the economy, additional revenue flows to the city and local businesses.

How is the Lavon EDC Organized and When Do They Meet?

The LEDC is overseen by a seven-member board of directors. The seven director positions are appointed by the City Council for two-year terms of office. Places 1, 3, 5 and 7 are appointed in even numbered years and places 2, 4, and 6 are appointed in odd-numbered years. The EDC Board of Director meetings are held at least monthly at the Lavon City Hall, 120 School Rd. Meetings are normally held at 7:00 PM on the scheduled meeting date and are open to the public. Lavon residents and visitors are welcome to attend. Meetings notifications are posted at City Hall. EDC meeting notifications are also posted on the Economic Development Corporation's website. Since schedules are subject to change, please verify the meeting date and time by visiting the EDC website prior to attending.

How is an EDC Funded?

The state sales taxes of 8.25% do not all go directly to the state to stay. They are distributed as follows:

State Keeps 6.25% City gets 1% Roads get .5% EDC gets .5%

If Lavon did not have an EDC, the .5% listed above would go back to the state and not be allocated to be reinvested back into our local city through projects and job creations that an EDC works to develop. The existence of the EDC is vital to keeping those local sales tax revenues in Lavon to serve the city development.

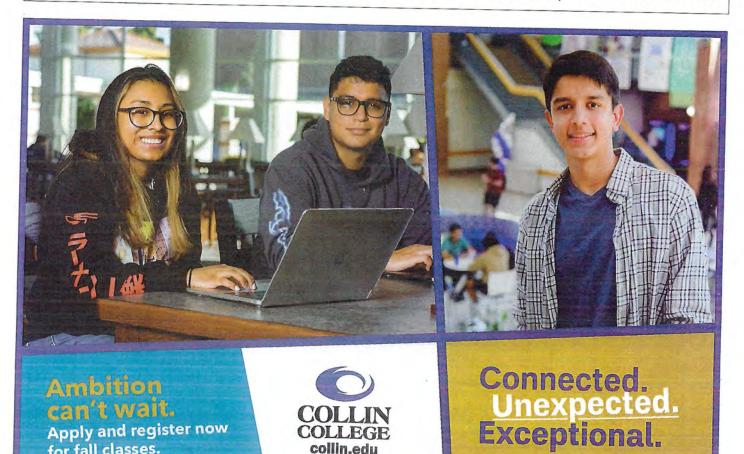

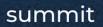

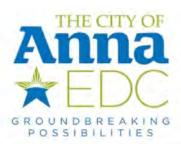

I'm happy to get these answered for you. Pam, nice to e-meet you. The NFC Grants Committee is excited at the prospect of Lavon becoming one of the newest partner communities in Texas to join the BCBS of Texas Campaign in 2023.

• Do they own the equipment or does the City own the facility on City land?

- Typically, it is owned and maintained by the city when it is placed on city property. This would be similar to the ownership status of playgrounds or other park infrastructure that exists in the city.

• Is there a guarantee of the time the equipment will last?

- The Fitness Court is designed to last over 20 years, with each component being made with the most durable, weather-resistant materials available. I've attached the warranty information, and you'll notice that the Fitness Court wall, which is the major structure, is warrantied for 25 years.
- Happy to provide some local city leaders who can give a firsthand account of the installation and durability of the Fitness Court.

If something breaks who fixes it?

- NFC's Partnership Care team can be contacted directly to replace anything that may need it over time. If it is something basic the city staff can handle, we will provide guidance on replacement. If there is more severe damage, we can coordinate an installation team to come to Layon as needed.
- I can share that these Fitness Courts have been in hurricane, flood, and severe heat conditions around the country, and so far have had very minimal, if any, damage as a result.

Do they provide programs?

- NFC's Partnership Services include ongoing program support, including our NFC Ambassador training program, which allows local fitness enthusiasts to become registered Ambassadors to lead programming and fitness events at the Fitness Court.

Hi Kim.

Great question. Lavon is in a State Sponsor region, and is actually located in a priority funding region for BCBSTX as a part of Collin County. Cities in the DFW area are typically receiving \$40-50k grants with successful applications that align with the NFC mission.

The difference typically comes down to strength of application, which is measured by the Grants Committee based on strength of consensus of commitment to the program, site location applied for, and funding availability. If the City and the EDC Board are able to commit funding to the initial funding requirement (which would be \$105,000 with a \$50,000 grant), then that would lead the Grants Committee to strongly consider issuing that \$50,000 funding award.

Second Question regarding Fitness Court Studio extension:

- **Regarding art**: The Fitness Court Studio option automatically upgrades to the Design Studio Art option at no additional cost to the city, allowing for a more unique graphic design on the wall.
- Estimated costs:
 - Initial Funding Requirement for partnership: \$190,000 less grant award (e.g. if you receive a \$50,000 grant, it would be \$140,000)
 - Concrete Install: \$0-40,000 est. (pending installation method; in kind service, internal install, or going to bid for contractor)
 - Fitness Court Studio Install: \$32,500 with NFC approved installer network team
 - **Total Estimate** (assuming \$50k grant): \$172,500-\$212,500

As a reminder, the installation components are needed at a later time, so some cities will handle that as a separate funding piece, while others will group it in altogether as a package with the initial Funding Requirement from NFC and BCBSTX.
